## Caron Butler Visits Cops N' Kids

Discipline. Determination. Dedication. And now you can add DONOR to Caron Butler's 3 D's.

To positively influence the lives of others, Caron employs the 3 D's as a framework for teaching youth the key to success on the basketball court and in life. Another D-word, "donation" recently came into play when he made a significant contribution to the Cops N Kids reading center. And while we're not asking Caron to make it the "4 D's", we are grateful for his involvement and support of the center.

Caron's donation allowed the center to renovate a portion of the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the center. There are 2 large rooms, now called the

"Caron Butler Accelerated Reading Rooms", that have added warmth, and engender learning. "The rooms allow the children to spend more time at the center and one-on-one with our staff of volunteers, giving them a better chance at literacy and long-term classroom success" states Margaret Drysdale, a Teacher at the Center who also managed the logistics of this project.

The changes were specifically designed so that volunteers can work closely with children in developing their reading skills. Warmth, smiles, and possibilities abound when one walks into the rooms which are highlighted by a beautiful mural of the Dr. Seuss classic *Oh the Places You Will Go*; graciously

painted by local artist, Jeff Ruggaber, also Julia's favorite book. She adds, "I am overwhelmed at Caron's generosity! Racine should be so proud that one of our own is making an amazing difference in our community, the Washington Wizards, and the lives of others!"

Caron's donation also covered 10 new computers for the computer lab; with software that helps children learn the alphabet and other reading basics.

## Donating Appreciated Property Saves Taxes

If you own appreciated property with a ready market, such as stock or collectibles, and are considering making a donation to a charitable organization, a good way to make that donation is to donate the items directly to the charity rather than selling the item, paying capital gains tax, then giving the money to the charity. The charity can sell the donated items without paying tax,

and the donor can deduct on their tax return the market value of the items donated.

There are restrictions on the allowable deduction on vehicles, which make them a less desirable item to donate nowadays, but appreciated stock is a great item to donate. If the stock is one that you anticipate

will continue to increase in value, you could turn around after the donation and buy the same stock back again. This way you get both a charitable deduction for the value of the stock, and an increase in the basis of the stock you own.

A straight donation of the cash would only get you the

charitable deduction. So it can result in a double tax advantage.

## Quilts On Barns

Take a drive through Racine County and you will see a little more color this fall. 14 barns, from Haban Park to Waterford, are decorated with 8x8 "quilts", a rural art project through the Racine Arts Council.
